• <u>Concept Award</u> – Innovative and untested (no prelim data) - \$75k over 1 year.

• <u>Idea Development Award</u> – Innovative and impactful research (some prelim data) - \$400k over 2 year.

• <u>Translational Research Partnership Award</u> – supports partnership between clinicians and labs (e.g correlative study).
